

Getting to Lotri Bay by Boat

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Launch Point

It is NOT possible to tow boats to the Lotri slipway because the final hill is too steep and narrow for trailers to manoeuvre. If you wish to bring a boat we strongly recommend that you launch it in Siavonga and then travel the last part of the journey by water.

If you would like to bring your own boat, you are welcome to launch at Eagle's Rest (with prior arrangement) and leave your vehicle there for a small fee, payable directly to Eagle's.

Likewise, if you do not have an off-road vehicle and require boat transport to Lotri, you may leave your vehicle at Eagle's Rest and we will be pleased to provide a boat transfer from there to Lotri. Boat pick-ups are charged out at \$60 each way, payable either up-front or upon pick-up in cash.

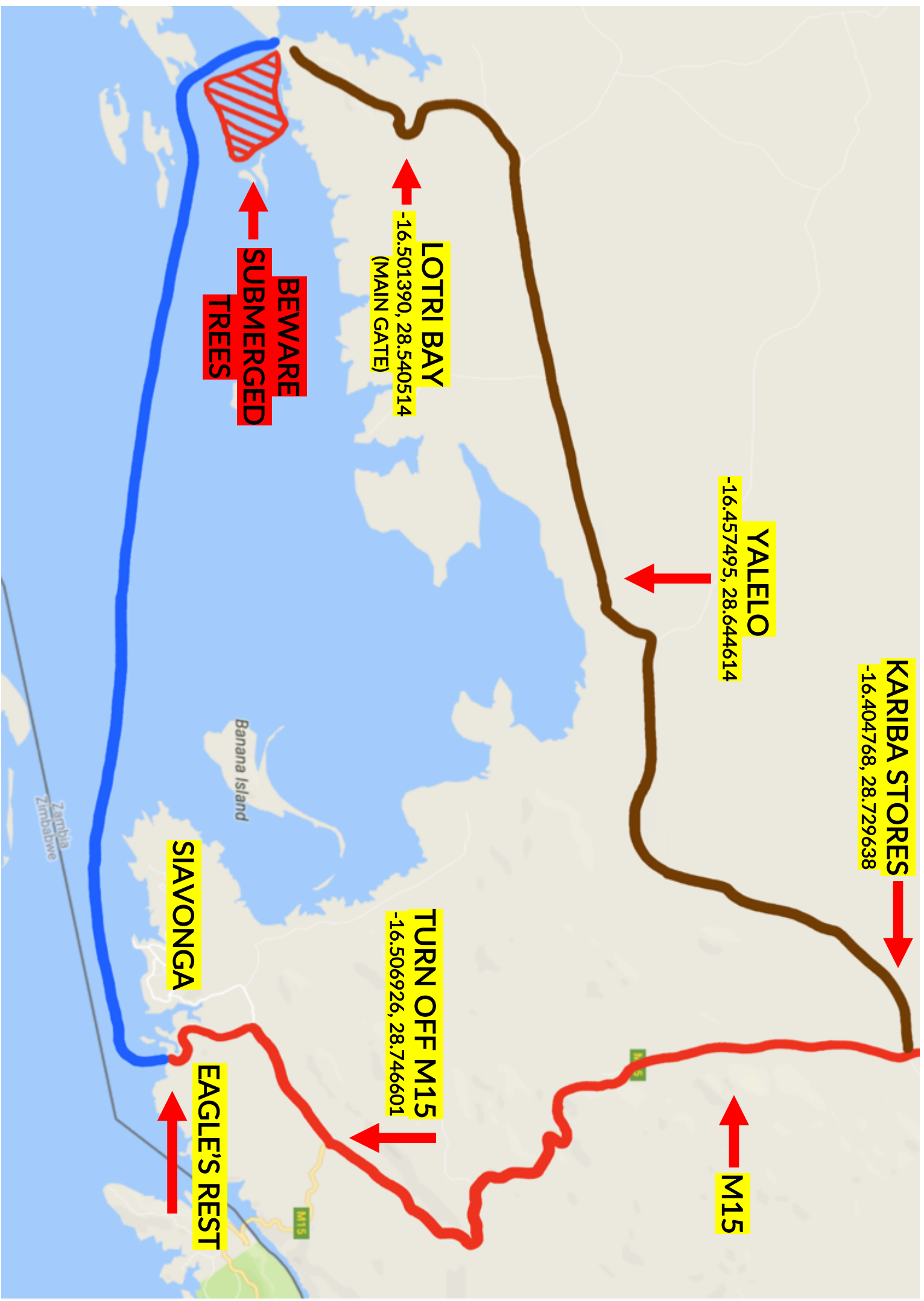
Please let us know in advance if you would like to launch your boat at Eagle's Rest and we will make the necessary arrangements.

Directions to Eagle's Rest

To get to Eagle's Rest, stay on the M15 for approximately 62km after turning off the T2. Just after you pass the Puma Service Station turn right, following signs to Siavonga (*GPS Coordinates at turn: -16.506926, 28.746601*). Follow this road for 3km, looking out for signs to Eagle's Rest on your left-hand side. Follow the signs to Eagle's Rest, which is at the very end of the road, noting that the road is in poor condition. Carry on through a small compound and you will arrive at the Eagle's gate.

Beware of Submerged Trees

If you are taking your own boat to Lotri, please be aware of submerged trees when heading into the bay (see map below for detailed instructions). Upon entering the bay, please moor at the house on your right as you immediately enter and we will direct you to your accommodation from there.
